

COLLEGE COLOURS

Rationale

- Students who achieve outstanding success in a single and/or numerous areas will be formally recognised by being awarded College Colours. Colours will be displayed in a specific badge that should be worn at all times.
- Colours are earned through consistent outstanding achievement, effort, commitment and success.

Procedure

- Students are nominated by a staff member for the awarding of Colours in a particular area, if they meet the criteria established for that activity.
- Students can also nominate themselves for Colours for outstanding efforts or performances outside the College community by submitting an application with supporting evidence.
- Students will be awarded Colours officially if they have met the criteria for a particular Colours category.
- When recognised each recipient will receive a Colours badge and Certificate.
- Receipt of Colours will be acknowledged in the Semester report and/or Year 12 reference.

School Colours

Academic:

To receive colours for Academia students must gain a total of TEN points from any of the following categories:

4 points	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• “A” Grades in English, Mathematics, Science and HSIE in a Semester report• Year 11 and 12 - A Grades in any four subjects in a Semester report
3 points	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A Grades in any four subjects in a Semester report

1 point	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Distinction in Academic Competitions• Participation at external Public Speaking competitions• Participation in Mayors Writing competition• Participation in external competitions (French Film)

Sport:

To receive colours in the Senior School students must gain TEN points in any of the five following categories. There are Colours for BOTH individual Sports and a general Sport Colour:

4 points	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• State Selection - NSW All Schools
3 points	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• District level 3 - CIS
2 points	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• District level 2 - AICES

Creative and Performing Arts:

To receive colours in Creative and Performing Arts students must gain TEN points in any of the five following categories:

To receive colours for **Community** students must gain TEN points in any of the five following categories:

Leadership:

To receive colours in Leadership students must gain TEN points in any of the five following categories:
