# Initiatives

## **Peer Support**

Year 6 students have so much to offer the Junior School in this role. Kinder Buddies has long been a fun way to connect with the newest members of our College. Peer support can take many forms; from creating awards for Assemblies, to leading “clubs or groups” during lunch times.

## **House Challenges**

These are challenges that are designed to build House spirit in a relaxed but challenging way. They occur on a weekly basis lead by the Junior School House Captains. Points are gained for the annual House Challenge Trophy.

## **Young Leaders Day – Held in early February**

The Leadership Activity Day at the Tomakin Club is an opportunity for Year 6 to consider ways that they would like to contribute to the College and the wider community. Students choose the initiatives they want to be involved with and create action plans to bring these to fruition. Our **Young Leaders Co-curricular** is a weekly session where mentors and students discuss direction, focus and solve problems to achieve their given initiative and stay motivated.

## **Young Leaders Induction– Held in early Semester 2**

During Semester 2, Year 5 students who are interested in applying for a Leadership portfolio will have a mentor from the Year 6 Leadership team and undergo an “apprenticeship”; a chance to experience the roles before applying for a position.

## **Year 6 Exhibition - Term 3**

As part of the Geography curriculum topic “A Diverse and Connected World”, students will explore economic and social differences of our Asian neighbours. They will choose a cause that they are passionate about and create and action plan to convey their message to the community and become an agent of change and make a difference.
