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Maths News

Welcome to Term Two from the Mathematics Department. I am pleased to welcome to the team Mr David Toghill and Mr Russell Fletcher (filling in for Sandra Megay). These two fine teachers are currently taking a Year 7 and a Year 8 group respectively. Tony Young and I are taking the rest of the classes in the Senior School.

Last week was NAPLAN week. There was a new structure for the Mathematics component which came through the system virtually unpublicised. Instead of two 40 minute tests there was one hour long test that combined both the calculator and non-calculator components. This cohort will also be the first cohort to go through and be 'required' to achieve a band 8 to be eligible for the HSC. This is something we have already talked about at St Peter's and we are confident that nothing will need to be changed in order to achieve this. Some students have been quite concerned (and fair enough given the media hype) that they will not be able to achieve this, however, they can take the test as many times as they need all the way up until their HSC exams. I know there is nothing to worry about, but trying to calm 12-15 year olds is no easy feat.

There is of course a divide in opinions regarding NAPLAN, but it is currently the only assessment that we have that is Nationwide. Of course it is not perfect but it does give us a snapshot of where the students sit in relation to others. I personally look forward to receiving the data and having a look at our strengths and weaknesses. The data we receive does impact on how we teach (even though it is 6 months later), and so in that regard I find NAPLAN to be useful.

There is a new Mathematics syllabus starting next year for Standard Mathematics (what is currently called General 2 Mathematics) in year 11. The proposed Advanced Mathematics and Extension Mathematics syllabus has been put on hold due to some unsatisfied customers and this is due to be put back to the public for review later this year. The intent is to have some more alignment between the more difficult calculus based course and the more 'real life mathematics' based course. The enrolment numbers into Calculus based courses has fallen severely over the past 20 years and the intention is to try and improve on these enrolment rates. I would personally like to see more students enrolling in Advanced Mathematics at St Peter's over the next five years.

Lastly, the Year 7 information evening was on Wednesday night with a delightful turnout. For those that could not make it the main message is that you will be getting a fantastic Mathematics education (and of course a fantastic education in general) with strategies based on evidence of learning and cognitive load theory.
